

# Patrol QUARTERMASTER

## Position Description Summary

- Set a good example by wearing full uniform, attending meetings, attending campouts, showing Scout spirit and living the Scout Oath and Scout Law.
- Keep track of patrol equipment and sees that it is in good working order. This summarizes your primary duties.
- Keep Patrol equipment at your house, or arrange to keep it at a fellow patrol member's house. If necessary, the table and canopy (large items) can be checked in, but this is not recommended.
- **Important!** At least two weeks before each camping trip you should ensure that the equipment is accounted for and in good working order. The chuck box should be clean and stocked. See list on lid.
- At least 1.5 weeks before the campout (Wed. night meeting) ensure that the patrol equipment is given to the grubmaster (or patrol members) going on the campout. Do not wait until the Wednesday before the campout.
- Collect the equipment back from your patrol members who took the equipment home to clean and dry it after the campout.
- Turn in your Patrol equipment during equipment collection periods.

**June:** tents

**December:** chuckboxes, water jugs, lanterns, tables, canopies (tables are checked/returned immediately)

- Sign out your Patrol equipment during equipment distribution periods.

**August:** tents

**March:** chuckboxes, water jugs, lanterns, canopies

- Make recommendations for new equipment or repair to the Patrol Leader or Troop QM.
- Demonstrate proper use and care of equipment on campouts, especially to the new Scouts. Actively check for proper tent set up, proper canopy set up, etc. Report abuse to the ASPL or SPL.
